

Advances in Constructive Approximation

Submitting Papers

1. Introduction The proceedings of this meeting will be published in a style similar to the proceedings of the Trends conference [1]. Contributions will be refereed and edited, and must be original work. Abstracts and summaries of work published elsewhere will not be accepted. Papers to be included in the proceedings must be prepared in **plain T_EX**, using a macro file called `at03.tex`. This file and other useful T_EX files can be downloaded from the conference web site.

2. Preparing your Manuscript. We recommend that you read *Sample Paper and Tutorial* which is available on the conference web site. The easiest way to prepare your paper is to fill in the blanks in the file `paper.tex` also available on the web site. If you want to take advantage of some advanced features of T_EX, including automatic numbering, insertion of postscript files, etc., you should input both `at03.tex` and `nash03.tex` into your T_EX file.

3. Page Limits. There is no predefined page limit since we want to encourage full-length journal quality papers. However, we expect the average paper to be 10–12 pages.

4. Submitting your Paper. Papers are due by **August 1, 2003**. Please send 3 copies of your paper (do not send your T_EX file or any figure files) to

Once your paper arrives, you should get an email within a day or two acknowledging receipt of your paper.

6. Refereeing and Editing. All submitted papers will be refereed and copy edited. After you have made all corrections, you will be asked to submit your final T_EX files and figure files.
